WEEKLY RECAP

June 5, 2017 thru June 11, 2017

Larceny

On June 5th an Oakland resident reported that their garden hose and sprayer were stolen from their yard between May 26 and May 31th.

Liquor Violation

On June 30th Farmington Detectives conducted liquor inspections at Farmington business. The Detectives found that the majority of those businesses inspected were in compliance, noting that only two citations were issued as a result.

Soliciting without a Permit

On May 7th a Sergeant responded to a Farmington business for a report of subjects placing placards on the windshields of vehicles in the parking lot. The Sergeant determined that that the subject responsible was another Farmington business owner. The Sergeant advised the subject of the local ordinance prohibiting such activities and that a citation could be issued.

Nuisance / Blight Ordinance

On June 9th a Commander responded to a Farmington residence for a report of large amount of personal and home goods on the front yard of a residence as a result of an eviction. The landlord was notified as well as the Code Enforcement Officer, who will monitor and conduct necessary enforcement.

Fraud / Swindle

On June 9th a Farmington resident reported that they received an unsolicited call from an unknown subject who was representing "8 Figure Dream Lifestyle" business opportunity. The caller boasted a business opportunity that, with a minimal investment, would result in up to \$30,000.00 in 60 days. The caller gave instructions to go to a CVS store and load \$275.00 onto a Green Dot Moneypak card, which they did, and then provided the Green Dot number to the unknown subject over the phone. The subject also convinced the resident to provide personally identifiable information over the internet. The case will be assigned to a Detective for follow up.

Attempt Home Invasion

On June 9th a report of a suspicious male was reported in the area of Cloverdale and Fredrick Streets. The subject was described to be a black male, in his late teens, wearing a red shirt, shorts, carrying a basketball. A neighbor reported seeing the subject walk around the perimeter of a residence. The homeowners reported hearing a noise come from their kitchen and stated that when they went to investigate they found a window and its screen open and three tree sticks on the floor. A K9 search of the area was conducted, but the subject was not located. Officers noted that entry was NOT made into the home and the neighbors were quick to identify the suspicious person. Area checks in the neighborhood were conducted and the case will be assigned to a Detective for follow-up.

Larceny in a Building

On June 10th a patron of a Farmington Fitness Club reported that their bag, which contained a school owned laptop, was stolen after being left unsecure and unattended. The case will be assigned to a Detective for follow-up.

Larceny in a Building

On June 10th a Farmington resident reported that sometime between June 6th and June 10th an unknown subject(s) gained entry to their apartment while they were in the hospital recovering. Stolen was a wallet containing money and other personal items, and jar ¾ full of assorted change that was kept on the top of the same dresser the wallet was taken from. There was no forcible entry noted, indicating that a key may have been used. The case was assigned to a Detective for follow up.

Suspicious Circumstance / Person

On June 11th Officers responded to a situation in Farmington's Downtown Center involving a subject that was verbally taunting a group that had gathered for a walk to raise money for the Armenian Relief Society. The subject's presence in a public place and speech was not unlawful, therefore Officers were not able to order the subject away. Additional Officers were called in to maintain the peace between the Armenian Relief Society and the protester, as well as for the safety of the public at large.
