SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Stolen Vehicle

On July 19th an officer responded to a home on the 20800 block of Farmington Rd. for a report of a stolen vehicle. Upon arrival the officer learned from the victim that she had parked her Lincoln MKZ in her driveway the night before. When the victim woke up in the morning, she discovered that her vehicle was missing. The victim did not know who stole her vehicle. On 07/22/2021 the vehicle was recovered in the City of Detroit by the Detroit Police Department. The vehicle had been stripped of most of its parts. The incident is being investigated by the Detective Bureau.

Catalytic Convertor Thefts

On July 21st an officer responded to the Yono Used Car dealership on Grand River Ave for a report of a larceny of catalytic convertors. Upon arrival the officer spoke with management who advised that the catalytic convertors had been stolen off of two vehicles that had been parked in the parking lot. The manager checked his surveillance video and noted that a black male driving a blue Chrysler 200 had stolen the two convertors at 5:55 AM. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Stolen Vehicle

On July 22nd an officer responded to the Kensington Manor Apartment complex for a report of a stolen vehicle. Upon arrival the officer learned that the victim's Dodge Challenger had been stolen overnight. The victim was able to contact Dodge and have the vehicle tracked. The vehicle and the suspect were located in the City of Detroit. The incident was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.



Retail Fraud

On July 24th officers responded to the Ollie Bargain Outlet on Farmington Rd. for a report of a male suspect who pushed a shopping cart full of air fryers without paying for them. While officers were in route, one officer located the suspect fleeing the scene on the M-5 Expressway. Officers stopped the suspect and noted that the stolen items were still in his possession. The suspect had taken over \$300 worth of items from the store without paying. The man was arrested for the theft and charged with retail fraud.

Larceny of Golf Clubs

On July 25th an officer responded to a home on Glenview Ct. for a report of a larceny of golf clubs. Upon arrival the officer learned from the victim that due to storm damage, the victim's garage was stuck unlocked. Sometime over the last two weeks, an unknown person had stolen the victim's golf clubs out of the garage. The victim does not know who stole the clubs.
