



## WEEKLY REPORT

December 5 – 11, 2011

### **DOMESTIC ASSAULT ARREST**

On December 5<sup>th</sup>, at 1:25 p.m., officers responded to a domestic assault in the parking lot of Farmington Pediatrics. The suspect and victim have a child in common. The male threw the female onto their vehicle and began pulling her hair. An amount of hair was found stuck to the hood of the car. The male was arrested for domestic assault.

### **CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING**

On December 5<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 4:40 p.m., a 9-1-1 call was made from Dedo's Grocery on Grand River Avenue requesting assistance. Upon arrival, officers learned that the man was a contractor hired to install a drain in the building. The man had been attempting to cut a drain in concrete utilizing a gas powered saw for approximately one hour. The man soon was overcome by the fumes and exhibiting the signs of carbon monoxide poisoning upon officers' arrival. The man was transported to the Botsford Hospital and an internal reading of the building registered over 180 ppm of CO. The building was evacuated while officers ventilated the building.

### **POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA**

On December 6<sup>th</sup>, an officer observed a vehicle run a red traffic signal and conducted a traffic stop on Freedom Road near Drake. The officer detected an odor of marijuana coming from the interior of the vehicle. A search of the vehicle yielded 1.4 grams of suspected marijuana under the passenger seat. The driver admitted the marijuana was his. The officer also observed the passenger to be unrestrained (no seatbelt). The passenger was identified and ran through LEIN where he had an outstanding misdemeanor warrant out of Farmington Hills Police Department. Both the driver and passenger were arrested and the vehicle impounded. The driver was transported to this police department where he was processed and housed. The officer issued the driver a citation for marijuana possession. The passenger was turned over to Farmington Hills police on their outstanding warrant.

### **WARRANTS OTHER DEPARTMENTS**

On December 6<sup>th</sup>, dayshift officers made three separate arrests of subjects on warrants from other departments while responding to a routine call and making traffic stops.

### **FELONY WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT**

On December 7<sup>th</sup>, an officer observed a vehicle with an expired plate (10/2011) at Grand River and Halsted. A traffic stop was conducted. The driver and lone passenger were identified. The passenger had an outstanding felony warrant out of the Wayne County Sheriff's Office (WCSO) for cocaine possession. The WCSO confirmed the warrant as valid and they wished to pick up the passenger. The passenger was arrested and transported to this police department. The passenger was housed for the WCSO. The driver was cited for an invalid license/expired plate and released from the scene.

### **POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA/DRUG PARAPHERNALIA**

On December 8<sup>th</sup>, an officer observed two occupants in a parked motor vehicle smoking on Lamar and Colchester. The area is utilized by Farmington High School students for parking. The officer made contact with the occupants and detected an odor of marijuana on their person and coming from the interior of the vehicle. A search of the vehicle yielded a baggie of marijuana, a marijuana pipe in the center console and an opened pack of Marlboro cigarettes in the pouch on the driver's door. The officer confiscated the marijuana, pipe and cigarettes. The subject was arrested, processed and turned over to his mother. The officer issued a citation for marijuana possession, drug paraphernalia and possession of tobacco.

### **LARCENY**

On December 8<sup>th</sup>, at 9:04 a.m., residents of Pinewood Condominiums came into the station to report a larceny of \$420 missing from their bedroom. The investigation found a cleaning lady was the only other person in the condominium. The reporting officer made contact with suspect. The money was turned into department and returned to the elderly residents.

### **MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY**

On December 8<sup>th</sup>, at 2:45 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the Farmington Post Office where a woman reported a man yelled at her and keyed her car because he felt she parked to close.

### **CREDIT CARD FRAUD**

On December 9<sup>th</sup>, at 1:30 p.m., an employee of Evolve Tattoo reported someone had used the owner's credit card for a fraudulent internet purchase. The credit card is used for the business, but the name for this purchase was an employee's and the merchandise was delivered to the business.

### **APARTMENT FIRE**

On December 9<sup>th</sup>, Farmington officers responded to the Farmington Place Apartment complex for a report of an apartment fire. Upon arrival officers learned that the resident had already extinguished the fire with a fire extinguisher. The fire was caused by a careless cook. Officers assisted in ventilating the smoke and no damage was caused to the building.

**MINOR HAVING CONSUMED ALCOHOL**

On December 9<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 9:42 p.m., an officer on patrol located a suspicious occupied vehicle in the rear of the American Legion parking lot. As the officer drove by the vehicle, the occupants exited the vehicle and all three appeared underage. The officer began a conversation with the three and noted that two of the three had an odor of intoxicants on their breath. The officer also noted an open bottle of Captain Morgan Rum sitting on the back seat of the vehicle. Two of the minors admitted to drinking the alcohol and both agreed to take a preliminary breath test. Both minors tested positive for alcohol and were cited for minor having consumed.

**ASSIST FARMINGTON HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT**

On December 10<sup>th</sup>, at 8:10 a.m., officers assisted Farmington Hills police in locating a vehicle that was involved in a crash in Farmington Hills. A Farmington officer located the vehicle and determined the driver was unfit to drive.

**LARCENY FROM VEHICLE**

On December 10<sup>th</sup>, at 10:10 a.m., a resident of Drakeshire Apartments reported her vehicle was left unlocked and someone had gone through the vehicle. At time of report, nothing was found missing.

**BREAKING AND ENTERING BUSINESSES**

On December 10<sup>th</sup>, at 10:30 a.m., officers responded to Farmington Vacuum on a breaking and entering report. The rear door had been pried open. Officers also found Craiggs Cabinets was broken into which is two businesses away. The vacant building between the two was also attempted. All had back doors pried.

**DISORDERLY CONDUCT, RESISTING OFFICER, DAMAGE TO POLICE PROPERTY AND MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY**

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, at 3:00 p.m., officers were called to Drakeshire Apartments on a report of an out of control person damaging the apartment. Upon arrival, the person tried to flee and was stopped by officers. The person then fought with officers and upon being placed in a patrol car, kicked out the window of the police vehicle. The person was transported to a local hospital for treatment and will face charges when released.
