



WEEKLY REPORT June 11 - 17, 2012

FAIL TO PAY

On June 11th, an officer was dispatched to 23620 Farmington Road on a civil matter between a cab driver and passenger. The cab driver transported the passenger to Grand River/Schaeffer and back. The fare totaled \$55.00. The passenger needed to run into his apartment to get the money. The passenger never returned. The officer was unable to make contact with the passenger. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

ODOR INVESTIGATION

On June 12th, at approximately 8:28 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Farmington Civic Theater for a report of an odor of smoke. Upon arrival officers were able to determine that the odor was coming from a burned out light ballast in the lower women's restroom.

FALSE IDENTIFICATION/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On June 13th, an officer stopped a vehicle for improper lane use and having inaccurate information on his paper plate on Halsted near Grand River. The driver provided the name and date of birth for his older brother to the officer. Utilization of law enforcement data systems assisted the officer in determining the actual identification of the driver. The driver was suspended with an outstanding warrant out of the Southfield Police Department. The driver was arrested for False Identification and Driving While License Suspended (DWLS) and processed through booking. The driver was also cited for improper lane use and released after posting bond for this police department and Southfield. The vehicle was impounded by Hadley's Towing.

LARCENY

On June 13th, a resident from the 33000 block of Kirby Street reported a larceny that had occurred in October of 2011. The resident stated she had some work done in her home in October of 2011. In December of 2011, the resident noted that a diamond ring and some other jewelry were missing. The resident suspected the employees that were in her home in October of 2011 but did not make a police report at that time.

CUSTOMER TROUBLE

On June 15th, at 12:37 p.m., officers responded to Credit Union One for an upset customer who was refusing to leave. Upon arrival, officers learned the customer was upset because he was being charged a fee to keep his money in the bank. The customer settled down and left without incident.

TRESPASSING

On June 15th, at 5:09 p.m., officers were dispatched to a report of trespassing juveniles at the Drakeshire Apartment pool. Upon arrival the officers were advised by Drakeshire management that the group of teenagers had been throwing water balloons in the indoor pool area and using graphic language. Management ordered the teens to leave and they refused. Officers spoke with the juveniles and ordered same to leave, the juveniles complied.

OPEN INTOXICANTS/MINOR IN POSSESSION

On June 16th, an officer observed a vehicle parked dark in front of a closed Kentucky Fried Chicken located at 20740 Farmington Road at 2:30 a.m. The officer made contact with the vehicle and identified each occupant. The passengers were consuming Taco Bell. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The officer observed a flask and detected a small amount of Vodka. Three of the four eighteen year old occupants admitted to drinking. The occupants were offered a PBT with results of .03(6), 08(1) and .05(2). A search of the vehicle also yielded a one third full 750 ml bottle of Burnett's Pomegranate Vodka. The officer issued citations for Minor in Possession by Consumption and Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle. The occupants were then released with the citations.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On June 16th, an officer conducted a traffic stop with a vehicle on westbound Grand River near Brittany Hill for improper lane use. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to consuming two beers. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .20(0). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver subsequently agreed to submit to a breath test at the station with results of .20 and .20. The driver was processed and housed until sober. The officer issued the driver a citation for OWI.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On June 17th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling at a high rate of speed on westbound Grand River near Smithfield. Radar confirmed 55 mph in a 45 mph zone. A traffic stop was conducted at Grand River and Halsted. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol at a friend's residence in Muirwood. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .13(3). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver refused a breath test and a search warrant for blood was obtained. The driver was processed and arraigned in the morning on a citation for OWI.

MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

On June 17th, at 10:32 a.m., an officer was dispatched to the 21000 block of Birchwood for a malicious mischief complaint. The resident pointed out several inappropriate figures that had been drawn on his driveway with chalk. The chalk figures were washed off.

RETAIL FRAUD WARRANT ARREST

On June 17th, at approximately 4:30 p.m., this department was contacted by the Westland police who advised that they have a female in their custody who has a warrant for her arrest

out of Farmington. The warrant was confirmed and a Farmington officer picked up the female from Westland police. The warrant was for a retail fraud that the female committed at the Grand River and Power Marathon back in January of 2012. The female was housed at the Farmington jail.
