WEEKLY REPORT

October 28 – November 3, 2013

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On October 28th an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River near Oakland for speeding 40 mph in a 25 mph zone. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming one, twenty-four ounce beer at a friend's residence. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .14. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a BAC of .13. The driver was cited for OWI and housed pending sobriety and receipt of bond money.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On October 28th an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River near Power for improper lane use. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming one or two shots of liquor at a friend's residence. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .13. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a BAC of .16. The driver was cited for OWI and housed until sober and receipt of bond money.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCES

On October 28th this department was informed by Farmington Hills police of a possible death threat of a city resident. Farmington Hills police made a home invasion arrest in which the arrestee is now making threats towards the co-worker who pointed out evidence which was crucial to the arrest. The resident was aware of the threat and was fearful. He was advised to obtain a Personal Protection Order (PPO). Contact was also made with the person who allegedly made the threat and he was advised to have no contact with his former co-worker.

ASSIST FARMINGTON HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT

On October 29th, at 9:18 p.m., officers responded to Grand River and Drake for the report of a rollover crash. Upon arrival it was determined to be a Farmington Hills crash and officers stood by to assist with traffic control.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 30th, at 1:21 p.m., an officer made a traffic stop on a vehicle for improper lane

use. The driver of the vehicle had a suspended license that was also expired. The driver was transported to this department where he was processed and released on personal recognizance bond.

HALLOWEEN GIVE AWAY PROGRAM

On October 31st members of the public safety department distributed nearly three hundred glow sticks and over two hundred bags of Halloween treats to “trick or treaters” in the City of Farmington. This marks the twentieth year for this event. It promotes a positive presence for Farmington residence and children of all ages. Patrol vehicles were also present to ensure safety for all.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On November 1st an officer stopped a vehicle near Grand River and Hawthorne for speeding and improper lane use. The officer noted the odor of alcohol coming from the driver/vehicle upon speaking to the driver. The driver admitted to having one beer. The driver failed field sobriety tests and was given a PBT with a result of .13. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a BAC of .15. The driver was cited for OWI and housed until sober and receipt of bond money.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On November 2nd, at 8:53 p.m., an officer made a traffic stop on a vehicle for improper lane use. The driver of the vehicle had a suspended license and numerous warrants from other police departments. The driver was transported to this department where he was processed and lodged to await arraignment or the arrival of bond.
