WEEKLY REPORT

December 23 - 29, 2013

ODOR INVESTIGATION

On December 23rd officers were dispatched to Edward Jones (21892 Farmington Road) on a report of an odor of smoke in the building. Upon arrival officers checked the building and found no problems.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On December 23rd, at approximately 4:07 p.m., an intoxicated man came into the police department to report that his ex-girlfriend had come to his home brandishing a firearm in order to retrieve her personal items. The woman left his condominium without any incident. The man does not want to press charges, but believes that the weapon was stolen. The investigating officer interviewed the ex-girlfriend who advised that she had gone to the condominium in order to retrieve the firearm that the complainant had previously stolen from her. The officer was able to verify the ex-girlfriend's version of events through a witness that she had brought with her.

SOLICITING

On December 24th officers were dispatched to the downtown shopping center on a report of two males soliciting for the sale of candy in front of businesses. Upon arrival the subjects were located and found to have a permit to solicit out of Farmington Hills and did not realize they were in Farmington. The subjects were advised to cease their candy sales until they obtain a permit from the City of Farmington.

TRESPASSING

On December 26th officers responded to on a possible customer trouble at the Dollar Tree located at 22084 Farmington Road. Upon arrival store employees stated they have had on-going problems with a frequent customer over allegations of lost property. Store management stated they wanted the customer advised not to return to the store, or he would be arrested for trespassing. The customer left prior to arrival. Officers checked the area and located the customer at a nearby apartment complex. The customer admitted to having an

argument with a cashier, but denied having started the argument. The customer was advised not to return to the store or he would be arrested for trespassing.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On December 26th, at approximately 11:14 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Farmington Road for driving at night with out headlights on. Further investigation revealed that the driver had been drinking at home and was heading to the grocery store. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was subsequently arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. The man was transported to the Farmington jail where he submitted to a Datamaster Breath test with a result of .15. The man was held until sober and could post bond.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Upon making contact with the driver, it was found that the driver had a suspended driver's license along with an outstanding traffic warrant out of this department. The driver was arrested and transported to this department and held pending his posting of bond.

UTTERING AND PUBLISHING

On December 28th officers were dispatched to Chase Bank at 23309 Farmington Road on a report of a female trying to cash a bad check. Upon arrival officers met with bank personnel who stated that the check in question was forged/copied. Officers arrested the female subject who passed the check and transported her to the station.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On December 28th, at approximately 7:19 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Jamestown Apartment complex for a report of a drunk driver being detained by the complainant. Upon arrival writer learned from the complainant that she was driving through the one way exit when a Cadillac drove the wrong way through the exit towards her vehicle. The complainant honked her horn until the Cadillac stopped. The woman noticed that the driver was one of the elderly residents of Jamestown Apartments so she went up to her vehicle in order to check her welfare. The complainant immediately noted that the elderly driver was showing signs of intoxication so she turned off the woman's car and called police. Officers noted that the elderly driver was still behind the wheel of the Cadillac and same advised that she had been drinking Vodka. The woman failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The woman submitted to a Datamaster Breath Test at the Farmington jail with a result of .17. The eighty year old woman was cited for OWI and turned over to a family member.

INTOXICATED SUBJECT

On December 28th, at approximately 8:09 p.m., an officer was at the World Wide Plaza when he heard a man yelling. Further investigation revealed an extremely intoxicated homeless man lying on a bench. The man was too intoxicated to communicate with the officer so CEMS paramedics were called to the scene. The man was taken to the hospital for over-intoxication.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On December 29th, at 2:36 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on eastbound M-5 near Farmington Road for having an expired temporary license plate. Upon speaking with the driver, an odor of intoxicants was detected and the driver admitted to drinking wine mixed with Red Bull. Following field sobriety tasks, the driver submitted to a PBT resulting in .11 breath alcohol content. The driver was placed under arrest for Operating While Intoxicated and held at this department until sober.

ASSIST OTHER AGENCY

On December 29th, at 3:14 a.m., an officer responded to L. Georges at the request of Farmington Hills police to assist with a disorderly subject. Upon arrival the officer assisted with crowd control for a short time and cleared the scene without incident

CARELESS COOK

On December 29th, at approximately 4:17 p.m., officers were dispatched to a residence on Moore Street for a fire alarm. Upon arrival the responding officer learned that the resident had accidentally burnt some food that activated the fire alarm. The resident advised that there was no problem at the scene.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On December 29th, at approximately 8:23 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Subway restaurant for a report of an opened business with no one inside. Upon arrival the officers spoke with the complainants who advised that they went inside the restaurant, but that there is no one inside. Officers went inside the restaurant and announced their presence loudly several times with no response. Officers went inside the back room and found the employee sleeping while sitting on a table. Officers woke the employee who advised that he had accidentally fallen asleep while working.

NOTE: The midnight shift also responded to five medical related calls for service during this time period.
