WEEKLY REPORT

January 26 – February 1, 2015

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (OWI)

On January 27th an officer observed a vehicle travelling with a headlight out and an expired tab on Grand River near Drake Road. A traffic stop was conducted at Drake Road and Grand River. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .14(0). The driver was arrested for OWI and the vehicle was impounded. The driver refused a breath test and a search warrant for blood was obtained. The driver was cited for OWI and held pending receipt of bond money or morning arraignment.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (OWI) SECOND OFFENSE

On January 28th an officer observed a vehicle travelling at a high rate of speed on Grand River near Lakeway. Moving radar confirmed 50 mph in a 35 mph zone. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .08(1). The driver was arrested for OWI. The driver submitted to a breath test with a result of .10. The driver had a previous OWI conviction out of Grand Haven in 2013. The driver was held until sober and released pending warrant authorization for OWI II by the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED (DWLS)

An officer on patrol conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding on Shiawassee near Glenview. Upon making contact with the driver, the officer learned that he did not have a driver's license. A check of the driver's record showed that he had a suspended driver's license and also a warrant for his arrest from another jurisdiction. The driver was arrested and brought to the police station where he processed.

ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On January 29th, at approximately 9:45 p.m., officers and Farmington Hills police units responded to the area of Farmington Road and Stocker for a report of a two car injury accident. Upon arrival officers determined that the accident occurred in Farmington Hills. Officers assisted the Farmington Hills Fire Department in caring for the injured drivers and assisted the Farmington Hills Police Department in directing traffic.

ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On January 29th, at approximately 11:58 p.m., officers and Farmington Hills police units responded to the area of M-5 near Gill Road for a report of a roll-over injury accident. Upon arrival officers noted that the accident occurred in Farmington Hills. Officers assisted Farmington Hills in caring for the patient and the accident investigation.

UTTERING AND PUBLISHING

On January 30th, at 12:14 p.m., an officer was dispatched to LOC Credit Union on a report of an Uttering and Publishing. Upon arrival the LOC branch manager stated that one of their members deposited three checks through the ATM that returned back showing that the routing numbers on the checks had been tampered with and were not valid. The case was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

MINOR IN POSSESSION (MIP) BY CONSUMPTION

While conducting a subdivision check in the Meadows subdivision (Chestnut/Maplenut) on January 31st, an officer observed a black male subject between residences at 3:30 a.m. The officer made contact with the subject and learned his identity and age (eighteen). The officer detected an odor of intoxicants on the subject's breath. The subject submitted to a PBT with a result of .10(7). The subject resided in the subdivision. The subject was cited for MIP and turned over to his father at his residence.

LARCENY FROM AUTOMOBILE

On January 31st, at 11:22 a.m., an officer responded to White Pines Rehabilitation on a report of a Larceny from Auto. Upon arrival the vehicle owner, whom is an employee of White Pines Rehabilitation, stated that she parked her vehicle in the lot at 7:00 a.m. and returned to her vehicle at 11:00 a.m. to find her driver's side window cracked and the door locked tampered with (punched out). The owner stated that her purse along with all of its contents were stolen from her vehicle. Upon further investigation, it was found that the victim's ATM debit card was used at a gas station in the area a short time after the incident. While the officer was still on the scene, another vehicle was found to have been tampered with (door lock punched), but nothing was stolen from it. The case was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

DRUG PARAPHERNALIA/WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On February 1st an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River near Smithfield after learning the registered owner of the vehicle had an outstanding Operating While Intoxicated warrant out of West Bloomfield. A traffic stop was conducted near the entrance of the Muirwood Apartments. The driver was identified as the registered owner. The warrant was confirmed valid by West Bloomfield police. During a search of the vehicle, a Marijuana grinder was located in the passenger's purse and confiscated. The passenger was cited for drug paraphernalia and released. The driver was turned over to West Bloomfield police.

NOTE:

Dayshift officers also responded to nine (9) medical emergencies, along with eleven (11) traffic accidents during this time period.
