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WEEKLY RECAP

October 5 – October 11, 2015

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On October 5th at approximately 9:03 AM an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding in the area of Whitaker and Arundel. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had a felony warrant for his arrest out of another police agency for conducting a criminal enterprise. The man was taken into custody on the warrant and an inventory search of his vehicle revealed 4.2 grams of marijuana. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On October 5th at approximately 11 AM an officer was dispatched to the Riverwalk construction site on Flander's St. for a report of a suspicious circumstance. Upon arrival the officer learned from the construction crew that when they showed up to work they found evidence that someone had been partying inside a home that was under construction. The construction crew is requesting more patrols.

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On October 6th at approximately 8:43 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Lakeway for an expired license plate violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a warrant for her arrest out of a nearby police agency. The other agency did not have the staffing to pick up the driver so the driver was advised of her warrant and released.

EMBEZZLEMENT

On October 7th at approximately 10:46 AM an officer was dispatched to a nursing home on the 34000 block of Grand River for a report of an embezzlement. Upon arrival the officer learned from management that they had caught an employee stealing narcotics from the facility and had terminated her. The employee had left the scene and the company wants to press charges for embezzlement. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On October 7th at approximately 4:36 PM an officer was dispatched to an apartment on the 36000 block of Grand River Ave for a report of a missing package. Upon arrival the officer learned from the complainant that he received a text message from UPS advising that an ordered package had been delivered. The complainant had not heard his doorbell activate or a knock on the door, so he went outside to check for his package. The complainant noted that it had only been 15 minutes since his package was supposed to be delivered, but that it was nowhere to be found. The complainant made a complaint with UPS as well as this department.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 7th at approximately 11:13 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Maple for speeding. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and 4 warrants for her arrest. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On October 8th a Hawthorne St Property owner came into the police department to report that he found liquor bottles and his picnic table moved in his backyard. The complainant advises that the home is his second property and that he is only able to visit it once a week. The man requested more patrols.

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT THIS POLICE DEPARTMENT

On October 8th at approximately 2:13 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and School for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver had two warrants for her arrest for unpaid tickets out of Farmington. The woman was arrested on the warrants and posted bond at the Farmington Jail.

CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR

On October 8th at approximately 5:45 PM an officer was dispatched to a report of a carbon monoxide detector going off on Elizabeth Ct. Upon arrival the officer noted that the detector was malfunctioning and had gone bad.

ATTEMPT FRAUD

On October 9th at approximately 2:49 PM officers were dispatched to a report of a possible fraud at a bank on the 22000 block of Farmington Rd. Upon arrival the officers were informed that two black males driving a white Cadillac had attempted to cash a check at the bank. The bank teller noted that the account used had only been open for two days and that the check was for a similar amount that was supposed to be in the account. The teller contacted the company that was listed on the check and learned that the company had never issued the check. The teller contacted police and the two suspects fled the scene. The incident was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT

On October 10th at approximately 1:28 AM officers were dispatched to the area of Grand River and Orchard Lake for a report of an accident. Upon arrival officers learned from the victim driver and several witnesses that a black male in a red Chevrolet Impala was driving

recklessly at a high rate of speed and crashed into the victim's car. The suspect then exited the vehicle and ran away on foot. Officers checked the vehicle and located a paycheck written to the suspect. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On October 10th, while investigating the above hit and run accident, officers located an intoxicated subject on Sherwood St. who knew the suspected hit and run driver. In the man's possession was 1.7 grams of marijuana. The man was arrested for possession of marijuana and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

FRAUD

On October 10th at approximately 5:45 PM an officer was dispatched to an apartment on the 35000 block of Drakeshire Lane for a fraud report. Upon arrival the officer learned that the victim was contacted over the phone by a subject claiming to be with the IRS. The suspect advised the victim that she was delinquent on her taxes and needs to send money to an out of state address or she would be arrested. The victim went to her bank, withdrew the money, and sent a MoneyGram to the address. The suspect contacted the victim several times, resulting with the victim sending more money out of state. In total the victim sent approximately \$9,000 to the suspect. The report was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On October 11th at approximately 8:10 PM an officer was dispatched to a report of a possible fraud at a pharmacy on the 23000 block of Farmington Rd. Upon arrival the officer learned from the complainant that a black male had come into the store to purchase a pre-paid Visa card with a \$100 bill. The cashier checked the bill and noted that it appeared to be counterfeit. The man took back the \$100 bill and left the store. The man was gone prior to the officer's arrival.

Note: Officers had responded to 17 medical calls this week and 7 traffic crashes.
