WEEKLY RECAP

October 12 – October 18, 2015

SOLICIT WITHOUT A PERMIT

On October 12th at approximately 1:30 PM an officer was dispatched to a report of a door to door salesman in the area of Moore and Fleming. Upon arrival the officer located the man who works for the Iowa Steak Company. The man admitted to going door to door to sell meat and did not have a City of Farmington permit. The man was cited for soliciting without a permit.

ASSIST OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCY

On October 12th a South Manor resident came into the police department to report that an unknown person had filed for unemployment benefits using her information. The woman does not know how her identity was compromised or who filed the false claim.

OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED 3RD OFFENSE

On October 12th at approximately 6:50 PM a Commander on patrol stopped a US Postal vehicle in the area of Grand River and Sherwood for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication. The driver failed several sobriety exams and failed a preliminary breath test (.08(8) BAC). The driver was arrested for operating while intoxicated and his vehicle turned over to a Postal supervisor. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail and a check of his criminal history shows two prior convictions for OWI.

CIVIL MATTER

On October 13th at approximately 7:02 AM an officer was dispatched to a report of a civil matter between a repossession company and a vehicle owner at an apartment complex on the 21900 block of Farmington Rd. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the complainant who was upset that a repossession company was attempting to repossess his vehicle. The complainant did not believe the company and wanted their paperwork verified. The officer noted that the repossession paperwork appeared legitimate. A LEIN check of all parties revealed that the complainant had a warrant for his arrest out of a west Michigan County for Fraud. The west Michigan County was unable to pick up the complainant so he was advised of his warrant and released. The vehicle was repossessed by the company.

ANIMAL COMPLAINT

On October 14th at approximately 7:25 PM officers were dispatched to a report of a dog attack in the area of Valley View St and Lakeway. Upon arrival the officers learned from the complainant that a neighbor's dog had attacked the complainant's dog, resulting in the complainant spraying the neighbor's dog with pepper spray to get it to go away. The complainant advised that the neighbor's dog had bitten her dog several months prior. Officers spoke with the dog's owner and cited same for having a dog at large.

IDENTITY THEFT

On October 15th an Ely Ct resident came into the public safety department to report that he had noticed a package delivered to his home that he did not order. Further investigation by the complainant revealed that there were three charges to his credit card which he also did not make. The resident is contesting the charges with his credit union and doesn't know who stole his information.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 15th at approximately 7:06 AM a Sergeant on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Cass for a defective equipment violation and for driving without a license plate. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was processed at the Farmington Jail. The driver was released with a citation.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 16th at approximately 3:02 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for having improper window tint in the area of Orchard Lake and Shiawassee. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and that the passenger had a traffic warrant out of the City of Farmington Hills. The passenger was turned over to a Farmington Hills Officer and the driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license. The driver was processed at the Farmington Jail and was released with a citation.

HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT

On October 16th at approximately 4:00 PM an officer was dispatched to a report of an accident in the area of Farmington Rd and Nine Mile. Upon arrival the officer learned from the victim that the other driver had rear ended the victim's vehicle while he was stopped for the light. The two vehicles pulled off to the side of the road where the suspect advised that he had an appointment to make and then left the scene. The suspect was tracked down by the officer who advised that he left the scene because he was late for a massage appointment. The suspect was cited for causing the accident and leaving the scene.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On October 16th at approximately 9:39 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for speeding in the area of Grand River and Warner. Further investigation revealed that the driver was in possession of 2.5 grams of marijuana. The driver was arrested for being in possession of marijuana and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED

On October 17th at approximately 3:14 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for speeding in the area of Grand River and Warner. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication and the driver admitted to having drunk alcohol at a friend's home. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for operating while intoxicated. The driver submitted to a Datamaster Breath Test with a result of a .16 BAC. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail until sober.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 17th at approximately 7 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for an expired license plate in the area of M-5 and Halsted. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and a traffic warrant for his arrest out of another police agency. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and processed at the Farmington Jail.

SUPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On October 17th a Farmington Hills business owner came into the public safety department to report that a disputed co-owner had closed a business credit card at a Farmington Bank. The owner investigated at the bank and learned that the disputed co-owner did not have the authorization to close the account. The owner believes that the other co-owner closed the account fraudulently in order to cause havoc at the company.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On October 17th an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for speeding in the area of Drake and Freedom. Further investigation revealed that the driver was in possession of marijuana. The driver was arrested for being in possession of marijuana and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On October 17th a Leelane resident came into the public safety department to report that he had received a bill in the mail from a magazine company. The man had never opened a subscription with the service and when he called the company they were unable to tell him how he was sent a subscription. The company cancelled the service and the resident was not out any money.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING

On October 18th at Farmington High School student and his parent came into the public safety department to report that his cell phone and jacket were stolen out of the Farmington High School locker room during an athletic practice.

Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license. The driver was arrested for driving on a suspended license and was processed at the Farmington Jail.
