WEEKLY RECAP

November 30 – December 6, 2015

LARCENY OF LAWN ORNAMENTS

On November 30th at approximately 7:13 AM an officer was dispatched to a residence on Loomis for a report of a larceny. Upon arrival the complainant advised the officer that sometime overnight someone stole two laser light decorations from her lawn. The complainant has no suspects as to who stole the lights.

ILLEGAL KENNEL

On November 30th at approximately 12PM an officer was dispatched to a report of an illegal dog kennel at a residence on Wesley St. Upon arrival the officer noted at least 6 dogs in the residence (current ordinance allows 3). The officer learned that the resident was running a Pug dog rescue out of his home and does not have a kennel license. The officer advised the resident of current city ordinance and gave him ten days to either find a new home for the dogs or to obtain a kennel license.

WARRANTS OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On December 1st at approximately 7:52 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for speeding in the area of Grand River and Cass. Further investigation revealed that the driver had 2 warrants for his arrest out of two separate police agencies. Both agencies were unable to pick up the driver so he was released and advised of his warrants.

HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT / POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On December 1st at approximately 8:41 AM officers were notified by dispatch that an accident had occurred in the City of Farmington Hills where the at-fault driver had fled the scene. The vehicle then struck another vehicle at Shiawassee and Farmington in the City. Officers stopped the at-fault vehicle at Whitaker and Grand River. The driver advised that she fled the accident scene because she had a suspended license and did not want to go to jail. Further investigation revealed that the driver had 8 suspensions on her license, 2 warrants for her arrest, and 1 gram of marijuana. The driver was arrested on the charges and housed at the Farmington Jail.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On December 2nd at approximately 1:56 AM officers were dispatched to the area of Grand River and Farmington for a report of a man who wanted to turn himself in for committing an unknown crime. Upon arrival officers located the man driving in the area, stop in the middle of the intersection, and then exit the vehicle. The man approached officers and advised that he was in trouble but would not state what type of trouble he was in. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and a warrant for his arrest. The man was arrested for driving on the suspended license and housed at the Farmington Jail.

CREDIT CARD FRAUD

On December 2nd at approximately 4:57 PM a resident came into the public safety department to report that an unknown person had charged over \$800 to his Credit Card. The resident has no suspects.

CIVIL MATTER

On December 3rd at approximately 1:36 PM a resident came into the public safety department to report that she has been receiving harassing phone calls from a collections agency. The collection agency was contacted and advised to no long call the resident, but to only contact her through the mail.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On December 3rd at approximately 1:50 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Blanchard and Grand River because the driver matched the description of the registered owner, who has a suspended license. Further investigation verified that the driver was the registered owner and same was arrested for driving on a suspended license. The driver was processed at the Farmington Jail and released with a citation.

FELONY WARRANT OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On December 3rd at approximately 10:51 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Pickett for a defective equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the passenger of the vehicle had a felony warrant for his arrest out of another police agency for assaulting a police officer. The man was arrested and turned over to the other police agency.

LARCENY OF WHEELS

On December 4th at approximately 7:55 AM an officer was dispatched to a report of larceny of wheels at a residence on Heatherton St. Upon arrival the complainant advised that sometime overnight an unknown person had stolen all four wheels off of her Ford Taurus. The complainant has no suspects.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE REVOKED

On December 4th at approximately 12:41 PM a Commander on patrol stopped a vehicle for passing a stopped school bus in the area of Grand River and Brookdale. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a revoked license due to too many OWI convictions.

The driver was arrested for driving on a revoked license and was processed at the Farmington Jail. The driver was released with a citation.

WARRANT ARREST OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On December 4th at approximately 2:50 PM officers were dispatched to a report of a possibly intoxicated man at a coffee shop on the 33100 block of Grand River. Upon arrival officers checked the man through LEIN and learned that he had a warrant for his arrest out of the City of Farmington Hills for defrauding an innkeeper. The man was arrested on the warrant and turned over to the Farmington Hills Police.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On December 4th at approximately 11:41 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Hawthorne for having an improper plate. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and 5 warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested for driving on a suspended license and housed at the Farmington Jail.

WARRANT OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On December 5th at approximately 1:04 AM a female came into the public safety department to post bond on an arrestee being held by the public safety department. Officers had previous knowledge that the woman had a warrant for her arrest out of another police agency. The other police agency was unable to pick up the woman so she was released and advised of her warrant.

NEVER ACQUIRED DRIVER'S LICENSE

On December 5th at approximately 11:26 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Farmington for a defective equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had never obtained a driver's license and warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested for driving on a suspended license and housed at the Farmington Jail.

OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED

On December 5th at approximately 11:48 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Drake for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication and had a suspended license. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for operating while intoxicated. The driver was processed at the Farmington Jail where he refused to take a Datamaster Breath Test. A search warrant was sought for the driver's blood and he was housed at the Farmington Jail. A check of the passenger revealed that he had a felony warrant out of another police agency for receiving stolen property. The passenger was also arrested and turned over to the other police agency.

SMOKE INVESTIGATION

On December 6th at approximately 11:52 AM officers and Engine 3 responded to a smoke investigation at a residence on Twin Valley. Upon arrival the complainant advised that she observed smoke across the river, appearing to come from a home on Hillcrest. Further investigation revealed that the fire came from a legal fire at a residence on Hillcrest.

OPEN INTOXICANTS IN A MOTOR VEHICLE

On December 6th at approximately 12:39 PM an officer was dispatched to a possible medical emergency at a pharmacy parking lot on the 23000 block of Farmington Rd, the complainant advised that there was a man appeared to be passed out behind the wheel of his vehicle. Upon arrival the officer observed a man sitting in his car. Further investigation revealed that the driver was not having a medical emergency, but had been drinking alcohol. The officer located a vodka mixed drink inside the vehicle and the driver was cited for being in possession of open intoxicants in a motor vehicle.

Note: Officers responded to 17 medical calls and 13 traffic crashes this week.
