SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Smoke Investigation

On October 26th officers and Engine 1 responded to the Drakeshire Apartment Complex for a report of smoke in a hallway. Upon arrival officers learned that a careless cook had burned some food, causing the smoke. No damage was caused.

Larceny from Auto

On October 26th a Farmington Hills resident reported online that her unlocked vehicle was entered by an unknown suspect while she was at the Total Soccer on Farmington Rd. The victim had money and several credit cards stolen and she doesn't know who committed the crime. The incident was forwarded to the detective bureau.

Larceny from Auto

On October 29th a Farmington Hills resident reported at the police front desk that on October 24th his wallet was stolen from his unlocked vehicle while it was parked at the Fresh Thyme Market in downtown Farmington. The victim does not know who stole his wallet.

Possession of handgun while intoxicated

On November 1st an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for speeding in the area of Grand River Ave and Orchard Lake. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was subsequently arrested for operating while intoxicated. The driver had a valid concealed pistol license and was in possession of his handgun when stopped. The driver's breath alcohol was a .15. The driver's firearm was confiscated and he was held at the Farmington jail. The driver is charged with OWI and carrying a firearm while intoxicated.
