City Administration referenced an earlier meeting in which City Attorney Schultz recommended adding a sentence to the fourth paragraph in Section 19-202 that would read, "For properties that are not registered within the required time, an additional fee for the added cost of the City's expenses in having to determine ownership, which may include, but is not limited to, title searches, shall be assessed and immediately payable. The payment of all fees required under this article is secured by a lien against the property which may be placed on the tax roll for collection in the same manner and subject to the same interest and penalties applicable to delinquent special assessments."

<u>05-09-102</u> MOTION by Wiggins, seconded by Buck, to adopt Ordinance C-743-2009 to amend the Farmington City Code, Chapter 19, Nuisance, to add a new article, Article IX, "Abandoned Residential Property Registration and Maintenance" to clarify extent of its application, as amended to add a sentence to the fourth paragraph under Section 19-202 relating to fees. CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE FOR PROPOSED FY 2009-10 BUDGET AND PROPERTY TAX RATE

<u>05-09-103</u> MOTION by McShane, seconded by Wiggins, to schedule a public hearing to review the FY 2009-10 proposed budget and millage rate, on Monday, June 1, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. and authorize the City Clerk to publish a notice of the public hearing. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

CONSIDERATION TO CERTIFY 2008 DELINQUENT INVOICES, AND WATER AND SEWER BILLS

Responding to a question from Councilmember McShane, Treasurer Weber advised all of the delinquent amounts are placed on the tax roll. He stated if the

delinquent charges go unpaid they are transferred to the County. The County at that point pays the City for all the delinquent amounts.

Mayor Knol expressed surprise the 2009 delinquent charges are less than 2008. Weber stated there are two reasons for this decrease: 1) water and sewerage use is down significantly, and 2) residents who were experiencing previous financial difficulty may be in foreclosure and the banks are making payments.

COUNCIL COMMENT

Buck noted the terrific job Brian is doing to ensure Channel 15 offers a variety and selection of innovative programs.

Buck noted the City recently received notice from the State that revenue sharing would be reduced. He stated it is extremely disappointing that the State has been unable to solve its own budget issues and is now pushing the burden down to local governments.

McShane recommended the City include in the next newsletter the availability of "video on demand" for residents to view City meetings, etc. on the web.

Knol noted there is a vacancy on the Commission on Aging. She further noted there is an opportunity for a college age resident to serve on the Michigan Suburbs Alliance. She stated they are looking for younger volunteers who will represent the ideas and concerns of their generation.

Knol announced Sue Buck, reporter for the Farmington Observer, has been transferred to another community. She wished her the best in her new endeavor.
