"An ordinance to provide for the prevention of fires within the jurisdiction or control of the City of Farmington and for the protection of persons or property from the dangers of fire or explosions and to provide for the inspection of property and premises within the jurisdiction and control of the City of Farmington, for the purpose of discovering and abating fire hazards and dangers of explosion; to provide for the administration of this ordinance and for the procedure for the enforcement of its provisions: to fix penalties for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance; and to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting herewith.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

- Section 1. For the purpose of this ordinance the following definitions shall be applied:

 (a) "Fire Commissioner" means that member of the City Commission who shall have charge of the Fire Department and any business or duties relative thereto and who shall be designated by the City Commission as Fire Commissioner.
 - (b) The word "building" means any structure, framework, housing, Public or private including tanks, reservoirs, or other receptacles for storage.
 - (c) The word "premises" means any lot or parcel of land exclusive of buildings as herein defined.
 - (d) The term "fire"Hazard" means any building, premises, place or thing which by reason of its nature, location, occupancy or use may cause loss, damage or injury to persons or property by reason of fire, explosion or action of the elements.
 - (e) The word "person" means any person, co-partnership, corporation or voluntary association.
 - (f) The word "occupant" shall mean any tenant in possession or any person occupying or any person having charge of any building or other premises.
 - (g) The singular of words shall also include the plural where applicable.
- Section 2. The enforcement of the provisions of this ordinance is vested in the Fire Commissioner defined above and it shall be his duty and he is hereby authorized to sign all complaints for violations of any provision of this ordinance.
- Section 3. In the administration and enforcement of this ordinance the rules and regulations prescribed by the statutes of the State of Michigan for the prevention of fires shall be followed so far as they are applicable to the conditions prevailing within the City of Farmington.
- Section 4. The Fire Commissioner is hereby empowered to make, adopt and promulgate such standard rules and regulations for the administration of this ordinance as they shall deem necessary, not inconsistent with the provisions hereof and the laws of this State.
- Section 5. The Fire Commissioner of the City of Farmington shall make or cause to be made inspections as often as may be necessary of the buildings and premises, including the interior of business and manufacturing buildings, for the purpose of ascertaining and correcting any conditions liable to cause fire and in violation of the provisions of the building code or ordinances of this city or of the Fire Marshall Law and related acts and the Fire Marshall regulations of the State of Michigan. When the inspector shall find in any building or on any premises or other place within the City combustible or explosive material or dangerous accumulation of waste, paper, boxes, shavings or other materials, in violation of the provisions of this ordinance, or any acts of the legislature or other violation liable to interfere with the operation of the Fire Department or detrimental to the safety of the City of Farmington or its inhabitants, he shall order the same to be removed and remedied in a stated time, not less than 24 hours nor longer than 30 days, and such order shall be complied with within the stated time by the owner or occupant of such premises.
- Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to burn any material whatever in any street or alley in the City of Farmington and it shall be unlawful for any person to burn any trash, lumber, wood, leaves, straw, paper, or other combustible material on any vacant lot or private premises within a distance of twenty (20) feet of any building, pile of lumber or other combustible material unless the same is contained in an iron,

brick or cement block receptacle approved by the Fire Commissioner. No such fire shall be started or permitted to burn before 70 clock in the morning or after 9 o'clock in the evening, of any day, nor shall the same be placed so as to injure or endanger any shade or ornamental tree standing in any street, lawn extension, alley, or any other public place. Noffire shall be built upon any private premises so as to endanger or be a nuisance to adjacent property.

No person or persons having charge or control of any premises within the City of Farmingtor shall permit any boxes, barrels, oil waste or rags, rubbish, waste papers, excelsior, or other combustible material to accumulate or be stored upon or within said premises in a manner to be or become a fire hazard.

No person shall place or permit to be placed any ashes in any combustible receptacle nor upon any combustible floor nor adjacent to any combustible wall or partition.

No person shall deposit or permit to be deposited any gasoline, naptha, fuel oil or other combustible or inflammable oil in any street, alley or gutter, drain or sewer within the City of Farmington nor in any other place where the same may be or become a fire hazard.

Section 7. No person shall place any receptacle containing combustible materials on premises of another without express permission from the owner or person having charge of such property, nor shall any person ignite or start any fire in a receptacle or otherwise upon the premises of another without having express permission for doing so.

Section 8. It shall be unlawful for any person to create any excessive smoke or obnoxious odors within the City of Farmington.

- Section 9. Any notice required by this ordinance may be served in the following manner:=

 (a) By delivering the same to the person to whom it is directed personally whenever such person may be found.
 - (b) By delivering the same to some person of suitable age and discretion upon the premises on or in which any violation of this ordinance or the regulations made in pursuance thereof is claimed to have been committed, provided, that service, under this paragraph shall only be made in the absence of the owner, tenant, or other person having charge of said premises.
 - (c) By registered mail addressed to said person at his last known place of address, to be delivered to addressee only, with a return receipt demanded.
 - (d) When service cannot be made as above provided, then by publication of said notice in a newspaper published and circulating in the City of Farmington once in each week, for two successive weeks.

Section 10. Any violation of the provisions of this ordinance and any failure to comply with any of the provisions of requirements of athis ordinance, or with any direction, notice, order or requirement given or made by the Fire Commissioner of this City, under the authority of, or necessary to the discharge of the duties imposed upon him by this ordinance, or by the charter of this City, shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisionment in the Oakland County Jail for a term of not exceeding ninety days, or both, in the discretion of the Court, and if only a fine and costs be imposed, the Court may sentence the offender to imprisionment in said jail until the payment thereof, but for a term not exceeding ninety days.

Section 11. Should any of the provisions of this ordinance be held to be invalid such holding shall not be construed as affecting any other part or provision hereof" be placed on the first and second reading. Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Commissioner Cavanaugh and supported by Hatton that the following resolution be adopted. Carried, all yeas.

WHEREAS, the City of Farmington in the County of Oakland, Michigan, desires to make a public improvement, namely, to construct a repair which requires operations within and upon the right of way of State trunk line highway U. S. 16 which is under the jurisdiction of the Michigan State Highway Department: and

WHEREAS, the Michigan State Highway Department is willing to issue a permit therefor, provided the said Department is assured of indemnity and protection against all liability arising by reason of Michigan law:

NOW. THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Commission of the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, that in consideration of the Michigan State Highway Department granting a permit to the City of Farmington upon proper application therefor, to construct Water Pipe Repair along and upon the right of way of State Trunkline Highway U. S. 16, City of Farmington shall save harmless and indemnify the State of Michigan, the Michigan State Highway Department, Charles M. Ziegler as State Highway Commissioner and his successors against all liability which arises or which might arise either during preparation for the construction of the repair along State Trunkline Highway U. S. 16 or during actual construction of the said project.
