1. ROLL CALL

The Special Joint Meeting was called to order at 6:31 PM by LaRussa.

LaRussa proposed addition of new Agenda item to discuss an Oakland County transit resolution.

3. INTRODUCTIONS

4. TRANSIT RESOLUTION

LaRussa noted that a portion of the Oakland County Public Transportation Millage earmarked a portion of their funds to assist communities with cost sharing for enhancements which improved access to transit, including upgrades to existing bus stops such as concrete pads, benches, shelters, etc.

LaRussa proposed a pilot project to enhance up to four existing bus stops with pads and benches. Specific locations for these upgrades are yet to be determined.

Motion to approve a pilot project to enhance up to four existing bus stops with pads and benches made by LaRussa, supported by Taylor.

PASSED unanimously.

5. CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY OVERVIEW

Weber provided background on the Grand River Corridor Improvement Authority (GR CIA), including background of TIF funding, budgetary status, planning documents, and initiatives which had been identified through activities such as public engagement, consultant findings, and CIA board deliberation.

Weber and the CIA board entertained questions from Council members.

The CIA board discussed mutual alignment of the above priorities with Council. Specific items of discussion included Focus Areas in the CIA Master Plan document (those areas deemed to be of particular transformative significance), opportunities to enhance pedestrian and cyclist experience along the Corridor, and discussion of the Corridor zoning overlay district (including the action to staff to provide details of the Overlay District to Council).

Similarities and lessons learned during past DDA activities were discussed.

7. OTHER BUSINESS

The group discussed code enforcement concerns along the Corridor.

8. PUBLIC COMMENT

Sophia LaRussa, 20953 Birchwood St., provided information regarding promotional activities at an area business.

Background:

In October of 2023 City Council resolved to support and participate in a Nine Mile Corridor Study funded and managed by Oakland County Parks and Recreation. The study included 6 communities stretching from I-75 to I-275. That study was completed and delivered to the 6 participating communities and can be found on our website at:

Subsequent to the completion of the study, communities west of I-275 to the western border of Oakland County are working on an extension of this pathway.

The Oakland County Nine Mile Pathway Task Force is now working with a consultant to creatively brand the pathway. Results will be delivered by the end of the year.

In October of 2024 Council approved a memorandum of understanding, which demonstrates the commitment of Oakland County and the 6 communities to work together on the continued development of the path. This MOU will be helpful in showing the support of the communities for the purposes of securing future funding of the pathway.

Administration will give a brief overview of the pathway.
