Special Event Request – American Cancer Society Relay for Life

Proposed Motion

Move to approve American Cancer Society Relay for Life special event request to begin Friday May 19, 2017 and conclude Sunday, May 21, 2017

Background

The American Cancer Society petitioned the City of Farmington to hold a fundraising event in Shiawassee Park, beginning Friday, May 19, 2017 at noon and ending Sunday, May 21 at noon. The *Relay for Life* is the national signature event for the American Cancer Society and a number of events have been held in communities throughout Oakland County.

They will utilize the entire park except the baseball fields. The event will include registration tents, a hospitality tent, and tents for the teams to rest or sleep. Banners and signs will be posted around and in Shiawassee Park. The organizers would also like to hang a banner and purple ribbons around Riley Park the week prior to the event.

The participants will walk around the parameter as part of the fundraising activity. They anticipate over 500 participants. There will also be portable restrooms within the site. While the event would officially begin at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday morning the event organizers would need to begin mobilizing Friday, May 19 at noon.

The 2017 event would be the 11th year at the Shiawassee Park location. In this time, event organizers and City staff have a good understanding of the operation needs that include: waste collection, restrooms, noise limitations, lighting, and proper supervision.

Proposed Motion

Approve proposed addition to Chapter 31, Division 3 of the City of Farmington Code of Ordinances to include an ordinance prohibiting:

- Moving vehicles in time limited lots for the purpose of extending parking time Civil Infraction
- Removing or altering a parking enforcement officer's tire mark, Civil Infraction

Background

A recurring issue with the enforcement of the time limited parking order has been with individuals who move their vehicles from one space to another for the purpose of extending the time in which their vehicle can remain in the lot. This so called, "car shuffling" occurs in both the north and south lots.

Another recurring issue has been with individuals who remove the parking enforcement officers "tire mark" for the purpose of extending the time in which the vehicle is parked in a time limited lot. This too has occurred in both the north and south lots.

Currently, Chapter 31 - TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES; DIVISION 3. - ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS does not contain any ordinances that prevent the above activities.

At the January 18, 2017 Parking Advisory Committee Meeting, the committee approved a motion to recommend to City Council the addition of a local ordinance which would make it a civil infraction for those who engage in the above described activities in time limited parking spaces. City Administration supports this recommendation.

Materials Attached

Section 31-70. – Time Limited Parking Zone: Violation as civil infraction

In a time-limited parking zone, a person:

- (1) Shall not move said vehicle within said lot to a different space, or the same parking space, for the purpose of extending the parking time of said vehicle beyond the legal parking time for said lot, which has been established for said parking lot by the sign or signage limiting the time in said lot.
- (2) Shall not intentionally remove, cover, alter or cause to be removed, covered or altered an ordinance officer or public safety official's "time mark" from the tire of a parked vehicle with the purpose of extending the parking time of said vehicle beyond the legal parking time for said lot, or otherwise shall not do so for the purpose of deceiving the ordinance officer or public safety official's monitoring the time which said vehicle has been parked within the lot.. Violation of the provisions of this subsection shall be a civil infraction in addition to any other violation of this section for parking over the posted time limit, whereby a separate citation shall be issued for violation of this subsection.

Review and Discussion

Background

This item is a continuation of the review of water and sewer connection fees (residential and non-residential) for the City of Farmington and surrounding area communities. It was briefly reviewed at the December 19, 2016 City Council meeting (see attached copy of minutes). Attached is a spreadsheet identifying current fees by municipality. Farmington's current residential water and sewer connection fees are \$300 and \$400 per unit, respectively. Non-residential water and sewer connection fees vary and are based upon a unit consumption factor by Oakland County times the City's residential rates. Water and sewer connection rates of surrounding area communities vary as shown on the attached spreadsheet.

The purpose of this item is to review current water and sewer connection fees, and to discuss whether the City of Farmington should update its current rates.
