Carmen Francis provided an update on Commission on Children, Youth, and Families activities and events.

6. OTHER BUSINESS

Christiansen introduced Joe Capozzoli and Lorenzo Cavaliere, interested prospective developer investors.

Cavaliere provided information on their proposal for the courthouse property that included 26-30 duplex cottage units, with an optional second floor, for seniors age 55 and older. They proposed a \$450,000 purchase price for the property. They are looking to tie this property to the adjacent bus depot property to create a senior living community with shared amenities.

Scott questioned the price point of the units. Cavaliere responded that the units would be in the \$250,000 range.

Cowley wanted clarification about the concept for the adjacent property. Cavaliere stated that it would be a retirement community.

Bowman questioned how the property would be operated. Cavaliere advised that it would be run as a condo development.

Schneeman asked what the units on the bus depot property would look like and if there would be connectivity between the two. Cavaliere stated that there would be a building on the bus depot property that will be a community within itself. The two properties would be connected.

Galvin asked what the next steps are.

Christiansen advised there are two proposals on the regular agenda. He stated Capozzoli and Cavieliere are asking for Council consideration, as they do not have a formal proposal.
