City Manager Murphy and Director Weber presented a five-year financial projection in order to allow Council to make informed decisions on spending in the next year. This forecast was based on general assumptions about City expenditures by function and revenues by source as well as rate of inflation. Weber reviewed fund balances, including less restricted and unrestricted fund balances. Council questions about the forecast were discussed.

5. SET MEETING FOR WARNER MANSION DISCUSSION

Bowman requested a date for a meeting to discuss the future of the Governor Warner Mansion. March 22 at 6:00 pm was decided upon.

6. OTHER BUSINESS

Weber discussed questions about something the Pathways Committee had been approached about. He said that they had been working with the six cities who are joined by Nine Mile from I-75 to I-275 to design a path that would go from expressway to expressway. He asked Council for recommendations about who in the community might be interested in weighing in.

6. COUNCIL COMMENT

Taylor had concerns about a Farmington Hills resident who had a complaint about Our Lady of Sorrows school traffic. Murphy said Houhanisin had been in contact with Farmington Hills and they are handling it.
