CONSIDERATION TO SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING ON 2002-2003 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM. Administration recommended Council consider establishing the following development objectives for the Community Development Block Grand (CDBG) 2002-2003 program year: (1) senior services (2) code enforcement, and (3) administration; and requested that Council call a public hearing as required by the application process.

<u>10-01-574</u> MOTION by Mitchell, seconded by Campbell, to call a public hearing on November 5, 2001 at 8:00 p.m. for public comment on the proposed 2001-2002 Community Development Block Grant program application. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

CONSIDERATION OF CONTRACT FOR CONCRETE ROAD REPAIRS.

Administration advised that the Public Services Department has identified several areas of roadway that need immediate repair. Administration further advised that in order to complete the work this year the Public Services Department has contacted Hard Rock Concrete, the City's low bidder for the 1999 Road Program. Administration advised

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that Hard Rock Concrete has agreed to complete this work using the low bid prices from 1999 Road Program bid plus a modest 6% increase.

<u>10-01-575</u> MOTION by Bush, seconded by McShane, to waive the regular bid process and approve a contract with Hard Rock Concrete of Westland, Michigan for the concrete repair of City streets in the quantity listed on the attachment which used unit prices from the 1999 Road Program bid plus a 6% increase for an estimated total of \$20,474.00; funds provided in the local street fund will require a budget amendment. Administration advised that Inland Waters has agreed to extend a prior professional services agreement, at the same unit pricing, with the City of Farmington in order to videotape the siphon component of the Sanitary Sewer Interceptor that was not part of the original agreement.

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10-01-577 MOTION by McShane, seconded by Bush, to approve an extension to the existing professional services agreement with Inland Waters Pollution Control, Inc., Detroit, in an amount not to exceed \$8,148.00 to videotape the Sanitary Interceptor Siphon; expenditure will require a budget adjustment, with funds provided by the Water and Sewer Fund.
