A special meeting of the City Commission of the City of Farmington was called by Mayor Hamlin on Friday, December 31st, 1948 at 10:00 a.m.

Commissioners Present:- Johnson, Loomis, Hatton, Miller.
Absent :- Otis and Bagnall.

The following resolution was adopted as follows:-

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, at a Special Election held December 9, 1948, the qualified electors of the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan and of the affected territory in the Township of Farmington voted in favor of detaching from the Township of Farmington and annexing to the City of Farmington the following described territory:-

"Part of the S.W. 14/ of Section 26 and part of the N.W. 1/4 of Section 35, T1N, R9E., Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, described as beginning at the S.W. corner of Section 26; thence along the West line of Section 26, due North (assumed bearing) 2634.34 feet to the West 1/4 corner of Section 26; thence along the E. and W. 1/4 line of Section 26, S.89°53'-58" E. 1481.41 feet; thence along a line lying 132 feet east of and parallel to the East line of Hawthorne Avenue S. 0°-06'-24" West 3088.80 feet to the S.E. corner of Lot 28 of "Regal Orchards Subdivision" thence S. 18°-51'-40" East, 25.18 feet to the Northeast corner of Lot 106 of "Supervisor's Subdivision No. 4, Farmington Twp.", thence along the Easterly line of said Lot 106, and said line produced to the center line of Grand River Avenue S. 31°-38'-24" W. 145.04 feet; thence along said center line of Grand River Avenue N. 58°-21'36" W. 1142.96 feet to the line common to Sections 26 and 35; thence along said common line N. 89°-21'-36" West 434.70 feet to the point of beginning, containg 97.091 acres more or less" And

WHEREAS, under the provision of Sec. 14 of Act 279 of 1909, as amended (Mich. Stat. Ann., Sec. 5-2093 1947 Supp.) it is provided that a City annexing part of another local unit is to get a pro-rata share of State funds distributable to that unit according to the ratio or population between the area annexed and the remainder of the Township from which said area was detached, and

WHEREAS, in the absence of an official census by which said ratio of populations can be determined, it is deemed necessary that a census be taken by the Secretary of State of the inhabitants of the annexed area and the remainder of the Township from which said area was detached.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Commissioners of the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, in accordance with the provision of the law, (Mich. Stat. Ann., Article 5-2093 1947 Supp. Page 55 and Item (2) Page 56.) that a request be made of the Secretary of State to appoint enumerators to enumerate all of the bona fide inhabitants of the area annexed to the City of Farmington and the remainder of the Township of Farmington from which said area was detached, as provided in Mich. Stat. Ann., Article 5-2085 1947 Supp. Page 50. This enumeration is necessary to establish the ratio of population between the area annexed and the remainder of the Township and to determine the pro-rata share of State funds, moneys or grants distributable under the law to the Township of Farmington, or to any County agency receiving State funds, moneys or grants in respect to population in the Township of Farmington.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this Resolution be attached to and made a part of the said request to the Secretary of State for the enumeration of the population in the affected areas.
