LETTER FROM DETROIT WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENT RE: RATE CHANGES. Administration advised that the Detroit Water and Sewer Department has

issued preliminary rate changes for its water and sewer customers for FY 2001-02. Currently it is estimated that water charges to the City of Farmington will increase by 11.46% and the sewer rate increase is estimated at 2.94%. Administration further advised that these proposed increases will be included in the city water and sewer operations cost in preparation for the budget next year. Administration will continue to attend meetings at the Detroit Water and Sewer Department regarding these rate increases. No action by Council was necessary.

LETTER FROM ROAD COMMISSION FOR OAKLAND COUNTY RE: FARMINGTON ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING. Administration advised that Phase II, reconstruction of Farmington Road from Grand River to Nine Mile, is planned to begin April 1, 2002 with an approximate completion date of July 1, 2002. Oakland County representatives will hold an informational meeting on Monday, February 26 from 4-7 p.m. in Council Chambers. No action by Council was necessary.

CONSIDERATION TO SUSPEND ACTIVITIES OF THE BEAUTIFICATION COMMISSION AND DISSOLVE CURRENT MEMBERSHIP. Administration advised that several resignations have been received from the Beautification Commission resulting in only two remaining members and seven vacancies. With this limited

CONSIDERATION TO INTRODUCE ORDINANCE NO. C-679-01 TO AMEND FARMINGTON CITY CODE, CHAPTER 4, AMUSEMENTS AND ENTERTAINMENTS/SPECIAL EVENTS. Administration advised that the ordinance amendments, as proposed, would allow the City Manager greater discretion in approving special event permits, and in specific situations, would not require City Council approval, thereby providing greater efficiency and timely response to residents.
