He thanked Bowman for her continued service on Council and highlighted her experience and willingness to serve as Mayor Pro Tem. He thanked his wife, Jennifer, for her continued and future support.

Schneemann addressed the voters and noted that many of them voted for change as represented by the new Council. He mentioned the wheels of government tend to turn slowly, so while we may have change, sometimes it takes time and that isn't necessarily a bad thing. He also reassured the voters who voted for incumbents. He stated that our services will continue and we will continue to grow and have smart redevelopment.

Schneemann discussed the sometimes contentious nature of election season. Moving forward, he asked for unity and goodwill in the community. He stated that we all love the City in our own way and have its best interest at heart. He encouraged Councilmembers to hold each other in high esteem, honoring and respecting the fact that there may be differing opinions on matters, but each want what's best for the city and its residents. He encouraged the public to keep dialogue civil even if there is a decision they do not agree with. We should all choose to keep the poisonous paradigm out of our city. We are not enemies, we are friends and neighbors. He

promised as the newly appointed mayor to do all that he can to continue the positive trajectory Farmington is on.
