- 1. Tree House at 33620 Grand River: There will be a public hearing before the Zoning Board of Appeals on Feb. 1. The commission did not formally express an opinion on the matter.
- 2. Friends of the Governor Warner Mansion: The relationship between the commission and the Friends board of directors was discussed. Agendas, minutes and pertinent information will be shared between the two groups. Grant writing, promotions, public relations, fundraising and membership will fall under the duties of the friends while the commission's jurisdiction will include operation of the mansion and maintenance of the collection.
- 3. Capital Improvements: Commissioner Grattan will make a list of necessary and suggested improvements for the commission to prioritize.
- 4. Commission oversight of donations: It was determined that there should be a formal acquisition process for all donations and that all matters pertaining to this process will be part of the public record.
- 5. Quaker Cemetery: After discussion, there was no objection to the Quaker Cemetery becoming a part of the National Park Service's National Underground Railroad program.
